Our Impact

- \$190,000 in grants was awarded to Jewish community partners to enhance inclusion and accessibility over the last 6 years
- 428 individuals received inclusion training
- 593 individuals participated in community awareness events to foster a shared dialogue and vision of inclusion
- 40+ Jewish classrooms received educational consulting providing strategies to make classrooms and teaching practices more inclusive
- \$21,000 distributed for inclusion and accessibility projects

About the Future

In 2025, we will:

- Launch a pilot initiative, engaging educators, parents, and students, to develop a comprehensive inclusion plan for at least 1 Jewish early childhood program and 1 day school
- Expand our large-scale grant program and invest 10 community projects that further accessibility and inclusion efforts in Jewish Atlanta
- The JAA professional team will complete the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) certification and develop accessibility assessments to offer to 5 Jewish communal organizations in FY25

JAA has established the Disability Synagogue Inclusion Committee, dedicated to fostering inclusive communities within synagogues for individuals with disabilities. This committee actively assists synagogues in making their spaces, information, and materials accessible. Moreover, it strives to enhance community awareness about the social model of disability, emphasizing the significance of creating inclusive environments. The committee convenes quarterly, providing a platform for members to connect, share ideas, and collaborate with one another to advance the mission of inclusion.
