### **JAccess Areas of Focus (continued)**

#### **Increasing Community Planning**

- Developed a Jewish Disability Professional Network to provide a platform to connect, collaborate, share resources, and provide support
- Ensuring that community events & material are accessible, providing community partners with this knowledge (CART Captioning & ASL interpreters at events as required)
- Emergency Preparedness Planning: Developed accessible emergency response planning resources, such as evacuation assistance, communication support, and shelter options tailored to individuals with disabilities. Linked in with FEMA, Live Secure & SCN
- Providing consultation and feedback for organizational expansion of housing and career services

## **Our Impact**

- \$368,300 in grants was awarded to Jewish community partners to enhance inclusion and accessibility over the last 2 years
- 1,667 individuals received inclusion training in the past 2 years
- 11,664 individuals participated in community awareness events to foster a shared dialogue and vision of inclusion in the past 2 years
- 40+ Jewish classrooms received educational consulting providing strategies to make classrooms and teaching practices more inclusive
- \$21,000 distributed for inclusion and accessibility projects

JAccess has established the Disability Synagogue Inclusion Committee, dedicated to fostering inclusive communities within synagogues for individuals with disabilities. This committee actively assists synagogues in making their spaces, information, and materials accessible. Moreover, it strives to enhance community awareness about the social model of disability, emphasizing the significance of creating inclusive environments. The committee convenes quarterly, providing a platform for members to connect, share ideas, and collaborate with one another to advance the mission of inclusion.



### **New in 2024**

- 5 x Jewish Preschools (5) are participating in the Disability Inclusion Initiative in partnership with Children's Health Care of Atlanta and Marcus Autism Center
- Developing a Parent's Disability Inclusion Leadership program steeped in Jewish values
- Working to strengthen employment for individuals with disabilities through partnership with UGA, Advancing Employment & JF&CS. Partnered in a conference at the Carter Center and the JAccess team were guest speakers on 2 webinars
- Consulted with community partner to increase capacity in development of neurodivergent programming to raise awareness and acceptance
- Collaborating with community partners to create and deliver best-practice training modules for disability organizations, ensuring that people with disabilities have the opportunity to lead ordinary and fulfilling lives
- Expanded innovative training sessions & modules
