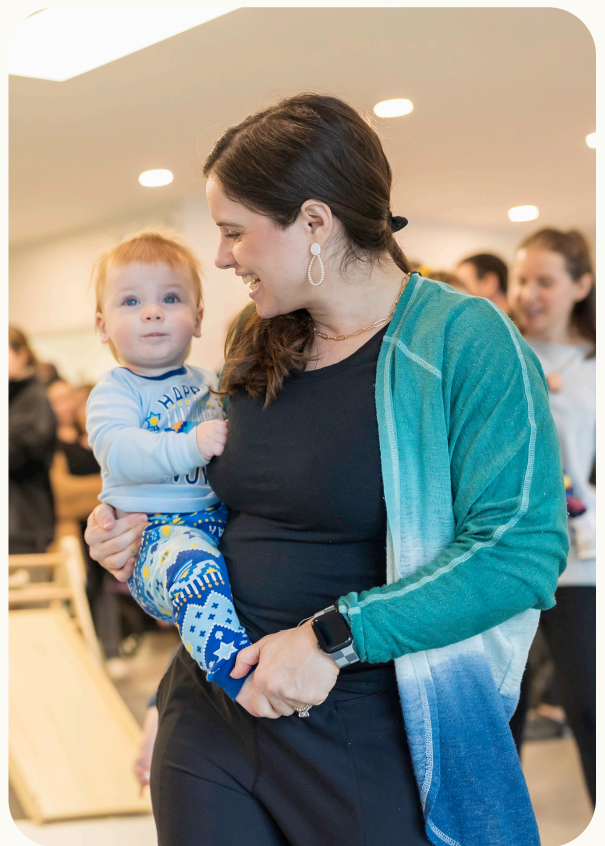

Our Collective Impact in FY25

The information below represents more than just metrics—they tell the story of a community that shows up, gives generously, and builds boldly. Together, in Fiscal Year 2025, we strengthened Jewish life in Atlanta, supported Israel and Jews around the world, responded to urgent needs, and invested in a safer, more connected, and more vibrant Jewish future.

Across our five core impact areas, you will see how your support helped Federation power life-changing programs, partnerships, and services for thousands.

This is what we achieved—**As One.**

1. Caring for Those in Need

Because of you, Federation stands as a beacon of support in life's most challenging moments. Your gift helps families facing food insecurity, ensures individuals with disabilities can access Jewish spaces, helps displaced Israelis rebuild after October 7th, and supports Holocaust survivors and seniors in need. You provide the essential resources that make compassionate care possible.

In Fiscal Year 2025:

- ✓ 130 educators at four Jewish preschools were trained through a JAccess partnership with Children's Healthcare of Atlanta—benefiting 500+ young learners
- ✓ 3,000+ individuals facing crisis received financial assistance and case management through JF&CS's (Jewish Family & Career Services) Bridge to Stability program
- ✓ 2,000+ older adults received residential and rehabilitative care through Jewish HomeLife
- ✓ JF&CS's Kosher Food Pantry distributed over 31,000 pounds of food

2. Jewish Education

Federation is committed to making Jewish education accessible to all. Your support fuels day schools, supplemental programs, Israel experiences, and lifelong learning opportunities that empower every person to connect, grow, and engage with Jewish life.

In Fiscal Year 2025:

- ✓ More than 840 children received scholarships and grants to attend Jewish overnight camp
- ✓ 5,400 children received Jewish books each month through PJ Library
- ✓ \$70,000 was invested in professional development for day school educators
- ✓ \$23,600 was awarded for innovative supplemental Jewish education programs
- ✓ Jewish learning experiences were enhanced for 6,000+ Pre-K–12 students
- ✓ More than 1,000 Jewish educators were supported through Federation-led professional development opportunities

3. Israel and Jews Worldwide

Our connection to Israel and Jewish communities worldwide remains unbreakable. Your generosity strengthens these ties by providing critical support, fostering deep relationships, and ensuring a vibrant Jewish future across the globe.

In Fiscal Year 2025:

- ✓ \$572,000 was provided to support Jews from Ukraine and across the Former Soviet Union
- ✓ Eight Schoenbaum Shinshinim engaged 2,000+ community members monthly in Israel education
- ✓ 35 local teens participated in a 2024–25 Gap Year program
- ✓ 3,500+ elderly Jews in Belarus received essential care through JDC (American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee)
- ✓ Comprehensive trauma and mental health support was provided to teen survivors from Kibbutz Nahal Oz
- ✓ 20 Ethiopian mothers participated in 10 parenting sessions in Yokneam Meggido
- ✓ 150 Ethiopian students attended summer programs during school breaks
- ✓ Year 2 of our Communities2Gether partnership with Nahal Oz supported a therapeutic teen mission to Greece and a Federation site visit

4. Jewish Engagement

At the heart of Jewish life lies the strength of community and deep, lasting connections. We ensure that every member of Jewish Atlanta—no matter their age or stage in life—has meaningful opportunities to engage, build relationships, and thrive within a supportive and vibrant Jewish network.

In Fiscal Year 2025:

- ✓ 135 engagement events were held through PJ Library and JBaby for young Jewish families
- ✓ 1,500+ young adults participated in Jewish engagement programs
- ✓ 114 teens received JTeen scholarships to deepen Jewish connection and leadership
- ✓ 2,422 unique students were engaged through Hillels of Georgia
- ✓ 10,340 individuals across 33 zip codes participated in Gather Grant experiences
- ✓ 60 organizations received funding for collaborative Jewish engagement initiatives

5. Safety and Security

Federation is dedicated to ensuring the safety and security of Jewish Atlanta. Because of you, we are able to strengthen our community through proactive security initiatives, strategic partnerships, and expert guidance that protect our institutions, events, and gathering spaces. By investing in preparedness, training, and crisis response, you help create a secure environment where every Jewish person can live, gather, and thrive with confidence.

In Fiscal Year 2025:

- ✓ \$450,000 in interest-free loans advanced critical security projects for Jewish organizations awaiting federal grant funding
- ✓ \$250,000 was distributed to 25 early childhood organizations for security personnel
- ✓ 871 security trainings, consultations, and assessments were conducted
- ✓ \$104,000 was invested in summer camp security upgrades
- ✓ Flock Safety cameras were installed at Emory and UGA for Hillel and Chabad facilities
