This year, the High Holidays begin on October 2. The High Holidays, also called High Holy Days, consist of Rosh Hashanah (the Jewish New Year) and Yom Kippur (a day of reflection and repentance). The High Holidays are a wonderful opportunity to make memories and be in community. Many Jews and their loved ones attend High Holiday Services, others host or attend festive meals and some seek out activities to start off the Jewish New Year with the sense of having a clean slate.

18Doors compiled the guide below, and listed synagogues and organizations that are hosting programs and High Holiday services in Atlanta and surrounding areas, where clergy and staff have worked in partnership with 18Doors or attended professional development offerings led by Rabbi Malka Packer-Monroe, director of 18Doors Atlanta.
